Dr. Linda Palfreeman is a Lecturer in the Department of Humanities at the University of Cardenal Herrera, Elche, Spain. The principal focus of her research interest has been the development of medical services during wartime and, in particular, during the First World War and the Spanish Civil War. She has published extensively on the topic with significant contributions to the history of health care and medical practice in wartime.
